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### **CHAIRMAN’S LETTER**

As I reported in August our Pension Adjustment Committee completed work on the case for a pension adjustment. We had already made our case to Congressman Barrett and were planning to make a presentation to Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS). As contract administrator for our pensions, SRNS would start the formal process by requesting authorization/funding from the Department of Energy for a study to determine the cost of a pension adjustment. The results of such a study were also requested by Congressman Barrett. We had a presentation prepared and a meeting scheduled with SRNS on October 8th. Prior to that meeting the mortgage problems and the stock market decline changed the landscape. We thought that it was not the right time to be requesting new funding from DOE. We expected that our present pension trust fund would have declined in value and that DOE would have to provide significant funding to meet ERISA requirements. We thought that funding our present pension fund would and should be DOE’s primary concern. We shared our thoughts with Mr. Munns of SRNS and he concurred. We are now scheduled to make the presentation to SRNS on December 15<sup>th</sup>. At this meeting we will only be asking SRNS to request authorization/funding from DOE to conduct a study to determine the cost of a range of pension adjustment cases.

Our focus now will be on the new Human Resources plan to be developed by SRNS and presented to DOE next summer. We will be presenting our position to SRNS early next year and working with them to maintain the pensions and benefits we received at the time of our retirement.

The recent large increases in Retiree Rates for Medical and Dental Insurance are of concern to the SRS Retiree Association. We understand that medical costs continue to increase and that DOE has mandated that beneficiaries pay a larger portion of the cost of insurance. However we think that these increases have and will continue to have a greater impact on retirees with a fixed pension.

On behalf of all the recipients of United Way services, I want to thank all of you who contributed to the 2008 United Way Campaign. Even though there were some glitches in the solicitation this year, retiree contributions set a new record.

Our 2009 membership drive is underway. I urge you to renew your membership and encourage you to recommend the SRS Retiree Association to your friends and coworkers who have retired from the site. The more members we have the more influence we have with our congressional delegations and the Department of Energy.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

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## **MESSAGE FROM SAVANNAH RIVER NUCLEAR SOLUTIONS**

To the Retiree Association:

Since the last issue of your Newsletter, we – Savannah River Nuclear Solutions LLC – are two more months into our contract at SRS. It is safe to say that every day is a learning experience, as you might imagine. As I mentioned in my first letter to you, our initial objective was a straightforward one: safe, effective operations. We have done that, but also recognize this will continue to be a day-to-day focus, every day of our contract.

As I write this, several things are worth noting:

-I met a number of people at the recent 25-Year dinners. I suspect many of you were included in that audience. I'm glad we were able, with the financial help of Fluor Corporation, to continue that annual tradition. It was very rewarding for me to see the faces of so many who built the Site, the camaraderie among the people and the genuine regard that so many SRS alumni have for the Site. Your support and encouragement continues to be very important to us and to the Nation.

-In October, the construction organization passed the 22-million hour mark with no lost-time injuries. That string of safe hours started in June of 1998. I am amazed by that kind of performance, and it strikes me as one more indicator of the legacy of safety excellence that is such an important part of the Site culture. We are doing our best to keep that focus, particularly as our workforce continues to age.

-On October 24, we had the pleasure of hosting DOE Under Secretary Bud Albright, who joined us for a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a new powerhouse in A Area. The plant is designed to burn waste wood (or, "biomass"), and replace the 1950s era plant that most of you should remember. It's a step toward energy conservation and environmental stewardship, and is a welcome development for us and for the State of South Carolina.

On a related note, Mr. Albright made it clear that the Department routinely hears from the South Carolina and Georgia Congressional delegations on behalf of the Site. I believe the term he used was "relentless" advocacy; we should all be encouraged by that, even as we approach the uncertainty of an election.

-Like me, I am sure that all of you are being much more attentive to economic news than perhaps you would like to be. It has been a difficult year.

Frankly, the state of the economy makes me that much more appreciative of the traditional government and government contractor pension systems. While my pension is obviously not SRS-related, I am a pensioner myself, so we have that in common. I consider myself fortunate to have the degree of pension security and protection that you and I both have.

With respect to the economy's impact on our Site, there are some impacts we know and some we don't. Like all industry, we are being affected by jumps in the cost of gasoline, of coal, of rebar, even of manpower; and we suspect that, after the election, Congress will focus on other more pressing needs than increases at SRS. We don't yet fully know what 2009 will be like – either from a budgetary or a political perspective. We do know that financial management will continue to challenge our abilities.

As I've met more of you, I've gotten a better understanding of the issues that are important to the retiree organization. As we go forward, I expect to continue that dialogue. Thanks.

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## **MESSAGE FROM WASHINGTON SAVANNAH RIVER COMPANY**

### **WSRC Signs Settlement Agreement**

Recently, many of you saw media coverage of a settlement agreement WSRC signed with the Department of Energy (DOE), the Department of Justice and the U.S. Attorney's Office. This agreement resolves a dispute that is more than a year old regarding pension cost assumptions made during contract negotiations in 2003, which also served as the basis for a WSRC request for equitable adjustment in 2004. Under the terms of the settlement agreement, WSRC paid approximately \$2.4 million for resolution of this matter.

WSRC has denied misconduct in this dispute; and the settlement agreement, by its express terms, is not an acknowledgment of liability. WSRC made the difficult business decision to resolve this dispute without resorting to litigation, which could be costly, time-consuming and very disruptive to accomplishing the company's critically important mission at the Savannah River Site.

WSRC fully and extensively cooperated with the government's investigation of the parties' disagreement over the handling of the pension contribution assumptions. WSRC remains committed to the highest standards of corporate compliance both with respect to the handling of pension and other cost information, as well as in all other aspects of compliance with applicable contract provisions, laws, regulations and ethical standards.

It's important to note that the government did not file any legal action against WSRC. I also want you to know that there is no issue as to the integrity of the pension plan, the funding of the pension plan by WSRC, or the handling of actual contributions to the pension plan.

I look forward to continuing to work with the retirees as we move forward with the SRS missions in which you played a key role.

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## **SRS RETIREE 2009 ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING**

**The 2009 Annual Meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 14, 2009. The meeting location will be St Angela Hall in Aiken. This is the same location used for the 2008 Annual Meeting. Please mark your calendar for this date and plan on joining your SRSRA Board of Directors and your other retiree friends for the annual update.**

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## **GNEP PEIS**

As an interested stakeholder, SRSRA recently received a copy of the Draft Global Nuclear Energy Partnership (GNEP) Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) from DOE/HQ for review and comment. The proposed GNEP Program, which is part of the President's Advanced Energy Initiative, is intended to "support a safe, secure, and sustainable expansion of nuclear energy, both domestically and internationally". Domestically, the GNEP Program would promote technologies that support economic, sustained production of nuclear-generated electricity, while reducing the impacts associated with spent nuclear fuel disposal. The PEIS evaluates impacts of expanding nuclear power in the U.S. using either the existing fuel cycle, or various alternative closed and open fuel cycles. SRSRA is interacting with SRNS on this subject so we can have a cohesive position. During the 60-day comment period, DOE will hold public hearings at 13 locations across the country. The local one in the CSRA will be at Aiken Technical College on Thursday, December 4 at 7 P.M. It should be noted that this is the only local meeting for South Carolina and Georgia residents.

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## **TREASURER'S REPORT** - Stan Smith, Treasurer

Our last Newsletter reported on financial activity through June 2008. This report covers the period July 1, 2008 through October 2008.

Closing Balance (10/30/2008)	\$36,235.58

The \$1,862.24 income includes \$1,542.24 in interest earned on CDs that matured in mid October. The closing balance includes the Association's checking account and two CDs with a total value of \$30,000. Among the major expense items for this report period are printing costs for the last Newsletter, software for the Membership Committee and a deposit on the 2009 annual meeting hall.

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## **SRSRA MEDICAL INTERFACE COMMITTEE**

### **Medicare and BC/BS Claims**

When a retiree turns 65 and goes on Medicare and elects to continue BC/BS insurance, they are now automatically rolled over to Medicare as their primary health insurance carrier and BC/BS as their secondary insurance carrier. In the past it was necessary for retirees to request this action.

We are, however, now experiencing a problem with BC/BS denying claims when they have not received a denial statement from Medicare. It seems that when the provider's insurance office knows that Medicare does not cover a procedure, they do not send Medicare a claim. They send the claim directly to BC/BS. BC/BS cannot process the claim until they receive a statement from Medicare denying the claim. We have notified CMS about this problem and they have agreed to send out flyers to SC provider's offices. In the meantime, please inform your provider's business office to **ALWAYS** send the claim to Medicare first, even if they know it will not be paid by them. BC/BS needs that form before they can process the claim.

## **SENIOR FRAUD TASK FORCE**

### **Medicare Discount Card Scams**

The Medicare discount drug card is available to people enrolled in Medicare, but not everyone on Medicare is eligible. If you are in a state Medicare program that provides drug coverage, you cannot get a Medicare discount drug card.

Often scam-artists will call, email, or knock at your door to sell you this card. If they do so, it is a scam. Under the program, companies are allowed to advertise their cards by mail, TV, radio and newspapers or other print media. They, however, are not allowed to call, send emails, or do home visits unless YOU ask them.

You can protect yourself and your loved ones from such scams by visiting the Medicare Web site, [www.medicare.gov](http://www.medicare.gov), to access a list of approved cards and other information or call toll-free, 800-633-4227. AARP also has helpful information at [www.aarp.org/legislative/prescriptiondrugs/rxcards/](http://www.aarp.org/legislative/prescriptiondrugs/rxcards/).

### **Telemarketing Fraud**

According to the FBI, individuals 60 years or older are prime targets for telemarketing fraud. Predators will often offer senior citizens a “free” or “low cost” vacation as long as you “act now.” If you hear such lines as the ones above, hang up. There are numerous other examples of telemarketing fraud that target the elderly. Consumers can be placed on the “Do-Not-Call” list by calling (888) 382-1222. The call must be made from the telephone number a consumer wishes to include on the Do-Not-Call list. Once your number has been on the registry for 31 days, most tele-marketing calls will stop. If your number has not been included on the Do-Not-Call list in 31 days, complain to the FTC at the number previously called. Keep in mind that some calls are not covered and you will continue to receive political calls, charities and telephone surveyors, companies with which you have an existing business relationship, and companies you’ve given permission to call.

### **BLUE CROSS/BLUE SHIELD EOB DEFINITIONS**

For your continued education, here are some Explanation of Benefits definitions provided by our BC/BS customer service representative that you might find helpful:

**Benefit Period** - the period of time you must pay any deductibles and coinsurance payments that may apply. Benefits begin once you meet the deductible. If you reach the limit, we pay covered expenses in full for the rest of the benefit period. Deductibles and coinsurance start over with each new benefit period.

**Coinsurance** - the percentage of the allowed amount you pay as your share of the bill. If your plan pays 80%, then 20% would be your coinsurance.

**Copayment** - a set fee you pay each time you receive a certain service. Some plans do not have co-payments.

**Deductible** - the amount, if any that you are responsible for paying before we start paying contract benefits. You do not send this amount to us. We subtract this amount from covered expenses on the claims you and health care professionals send to us.

**Less Benefit Limitation** - the amount that is more than your contract allows for this type of service. Your plan covers these services until you have reached the limit of your benefits.

**Network Participation** - this column shows whether or not the health care professional who provided the service participates in our network. If "YES" this is a network participant. If "NO" this is not a network participant. If "N/A", the issue doesn't apply to your coverage, or this particular claim.

Out-of-pocket-maximum - the highest amount of the covered expenses you will have to pay during a benefit period.

Total Benefit Allowed - the amount we would have paid if another insurance carrier were not involved.

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## **BC/BS SERVICE CONCERNS**

We receive letters from retirees trying to get proper Blue Cross/Blue Shield reimbursement for their medical bills. Most of the problems occur when the retiree/patient lives out-of-state (i.e., no longer in SC). 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## **SRS ACTIVITIES (INCLUDES DOE, SRNS AND WSRC)**

### **Liquid Waste Program Contract Update**

On September 13, 2007, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Savannah River Operations Office (SR) issued its Request for Proposals for the competitive selection of a Liquid Waste Program contractor at the Savannah River Site (SRS). DOE anticipates awarding this contract sometime during the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2009.

### **Request for Proposals To Provide Security Services For SRS**

On September 26, 2008, DOE's Environmental Management Consolidated Business Center issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the procurement of protective force security services at the Savannah River Site. The services to be provided include protection of government-owned or leased property and material, Special Nuclear Material, classified and sensitive information, vital facilities, support facilities, government and other employees and visitors for the SRS. ### **SRS Fulfills Uranium Shipment Contract With TVA**

The week of September 29, 2008, DOE safely sent its final shipment of Cold War era uranium to the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), marking a significant step toward achieving the Department's goal of safely cleaning up SRS. As part of an interagency agreement with TVA, DOE down blended highly enriched uranium (HEU) and provided a low-enriched uranium (LEU) solution to commercial fuel fabricators who will process the solution into fuel for TVA's power reactors. SRS has made 283 shipments since 2003 – enough LEU to power every home in the United States for 55 days, or every home in South Carolina for 11 years.

### **Annual SRS Environmental Report Released**

DOE's Savannah River Site recorded an outstanding year in environmental compliance during 2007, and its operations continued to result in minimal radiation impact to the offsite public according to the September 30, 2008, release of the *SRS Environmental Report for 2007*. ## **SRS Small Business Contract Update**

On October 9, 2008, DOE issued a synopsis in FedBizOpps of its intention to non-competitively incorporate Information Technology and Medical services into its new Management and Operating (M&O) Contract with Savannah River Nuclear Solutions, LLC (SRNS) in a prudent action to ensure protection of incumbent employee pensions. These functions were initially excluded from the Department's SRS M&O contract solicitation in support of a DOE Complex-wide effort to increase small business participation with its prime contracts.

## **SRNL To Lead Center For Advancing Hydrogen Vehicles**

On October 9, 2008, the Department announced its selection of a team led by DOE's Savannah River National Laboratory as its new Hydrogen Storage Engineering Center of Excellence. The Hydrogen Storage Engineering Center of Excellence is a virtual center made up of 10 partners at various locations around the country, and is anticipated to run for approximately five years. The Center supports the President's Advanced Energy Initiative to reduce our Nation's dependence on foreign energy sources by changing the way we power our cars, homes, and businesses.

## **New Highly Efficient, Clean Energy Steam Plant Begins Operations at SRS**

SRS officials have replaced a 1950s-era, coal-powered, steam generating power plant with a new, state-of-art facility that burns "biomass" – waste wood from the logging industry and other sources. The new A-Area plant provides steam for industrial uses to the Savannah River National Laboratory and administrative facilities.

## **SRS Effluent Treatment Project Facility Celebrates 20 Years of Successful Operation**

The Site's Effluent Treatment Project – the little facility that could – celebrated its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of operations in October.

Small by most SRS standards – 21,000-square-foot facility with 45 employees working around the clock – ETP treats on-site low-level radioactive wastewater until it meets the federal Clean Water Act standards. At that point, ETP releases the treated water to on-site streams. Before ETP was built, this wastewater was sent to on-site seepage basins. The facility began operations on Oct. 21, 1988. Since that time, it has treated approximately 350 million gallons of water. ETP is part of the Site's liquid waste operations, which is managed by the Washington Savannah River Company (WSRC).
